

Pack 608 Family Campout – Spring 2009

- Q 1. What is it?**
- A family oriented, Pack organized, campout.
- Q 2. When is it?**
- From 4:30pm on Friday March 13th through noon on Sunday March 15th.
 - You may arrive at camp at any time from 4:30pm on Friday through Saturday, but please sign in when joining camp and sign out when leaving camp.
- Q 3. Where is it?**
- Bert Adams Scout Reservation.
 - 218 Boy Scout Road, Covington, GA 30016
 - Pack 608 signs will direct you to our assigned camping area
- Q 4. How much does it cost?**
- Free. The cost is covered by your Pack dues
- Q 5. Who can attend?**
- This trip is open to Cub Scout families, including grandparents, parents and siblings.
- Q 6. What is involved:**
- Two nights of tent camping
 - Friday evening meal
 - Saturday breakfast, lunch and dinner
 - Sunday breakfast
 - Planned activities for the boys from Friday afternoon through Sunday morning
 - Saturday night Pack Campfire
- Q 7. Will transportation be provided?**
- No. This will be a self drive event, but please make every effort to carpool.
- Q 8. What do we bring with us?**
- You will need to bring your own camping equipment (see Camping Checklist for suggested items). If you do not have any of these items, please let the Campout Coordinator know since we should be able to arrange for you to borrow any equipment you do not have.
 - All meals will be prepared as a Pack and individual cooking is strongly discouraged, however if you have a two burner stove or a turkey fryer that you would be willing to let the Pack use, please contact the Campout Coordinator.
- Q 9. What is the accommodation like?**
- You will be sleeping in your own tents. Toilet facilities vary from campsite to campsite and may range from Pit Toilets up to full Shower Blocks, but there may be a short walk to reach them.
- Q 10. Can we bring additional food and drink?**
- Yes. Although families are strongly discouraged from doing any individual cooking, they are more than welcome to bring additional snacks and drinks as desired. Please remember to take home any trash you find in and around your campsite.

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Q 11. Are there any age requirements?

- No. However all youth must have parental supervision. Due to Cub Scout Youth Protection Regulations children may only sleep in a tent with their own family. Sorry, there can be no exceptions to this.

Q 12. Can a father bring a daughter, or a mother bring a son?

- Yes, providing children only sleep in a tent with their own parent.

Q 13. Do we have to sleep at the camp?

- No. While the fun of camping is one of the main reasons that boys join Cub Scouts we understand that it is not for everyone. If you are unwilling or unable to sleep overnight at the camp you may still attend the daytime activities, however please remember to sign in and out of camp.

Q 14. Do I need to register?

- Yes. Please either complete the eVite form to let us know who and how many people in your family will be attending, or otherwise contact the Campout Coordinator so that they can update your status. We use these figures to determine the quantity of supplies required.

Q 15. What happens if I register but am then unable to attend?

- If you know ahead of time that you will not be able to attend, please change your eVite response accordingly as this will help us more accurately determine the quantity of supplies needed. If this is a last minute change, please try to let your Den Leader know so that they are not expecting you.

Q 16. How do I sign-up?

- Look for an eVite entitled 'Pack 608 Campout'. Click on the link and respond with the total number of people that you would like to bring.
- Please enter the names of the people attending in the comments section so that we can create a provisional roster.

Q 17. How can I help out?

- All meals at the campout are cooked by the parents by Rank as follows (with all supplies provided by the Pack):
 - Friday Dinner – All
 - Saturday Breakfast – All Wolf parents
 - Saturday Lunch – All Webelos I and II parents
 - Saturday Dinner – All Tiger parents
 - Sunday Breakfast – All Bear parents
- Other volunteers are required for the following:
 - Campout Committee – to help plan the Campout ahead of time
 - Supplies purchase during the day prior to the campout – 2 people
 - Load U-haul at storage facility – Friday noon-1pm – 3 people
 - Campsite Prep – Friday 4-6pm – 3 people
 - Activities coordinators – Saturday noon-4pm - 8 people (two per rank)
 - Campfire Crew – Saturday 7pm – 9pm – 3 people
 - Campsite cleanup crew – Sunday 11am-noon - 8 people (two per rank)
 - Reload U-haul at camp – Sunday 9-10am – 4 people
 - Unload U-haul at storage facility – Sunday 5-6pm – 3 people
